1 Introduction

Atlas Iron Pty Ltd (Atlas) is operating and developing the Sanjiv Ridge Direct Shipping Ore (DSO) Project (the Project) (previously known as Corunna Downs). The Project is an iron ore mine located in the Pilbara region of Western Australia, approximately 240 km southeast of Port Hedland and 33 km south of Marble Bar.

The Project involves mining five open pits (Split rock, Razorback, Shark Gully, Runway North and Runway South), using conventional drill and blast, load and haul methods to extract an iron ore resource of approximately 23.1 million tonnes (Mt) over a mine life of approximately six years. Ore is trucked to the run-of-mine (ROM) pad for crushing and screening with the final product hauled to Utah Point in Port Hedland for export overseas.

The Project is approved under Ministerial Statement 1125 (MS1125, published 12 March 2020). As part of MS1125, Atlas are required to submit a Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) to the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) annually by the 1st of June to satisfy condition 4-6. This CAR is for the reporting period 12 March 2021 to 11 March 2022.

2 Project Implementation Status

2.1 Project Milestones

Construction of the Project was completed in March 2021 and operations commenced in February 2021. Key project milestones completed to date include but are not limited to:

• Construction:

- o Mine Operations Centre (MOC) and administration area;
- Mining contractors' yard and workshop;
- Haulage contractor's workshop;
- Stockyard;
- Explosives magazine and AN prill storage;
- Water production bores and turkey's nests;
- Sewage facility and irrigation spray field;
- Fuel storage and refuelling areas;
- o Borrow pits;
- Accommodation camp;
- o Communications towers; and
- o Landfill facility.

Operations:

- o Mining of Runway South, Runway North, Shark Gully and Split Rock pits;
- Commenced construction of Split rock and Runway Waste Rock Dumps;
- o Shark Gully low grade ore stockpile (in progress);
- o Haul roads, access roads and tracks; and
- o Bioremediation Facility.

4 Details of Declared Compliance Status

4.1 Audit Criteria

The audit was carried out using the DWER-approved audit table for MS 1125, comprising of Ministerial conditions M1-M7 (Section 4.5; Table 2).

4.2 Audit Process

The audit was conducted by Erin Gibbens and Edward Swinhoe, Environmental Advisors at Sanjiv Ridge. The audit was performed at the Project site during May 2022, and involved reviewing documents and records and interviews with Project personnel.

4.3 Assessment of compliance

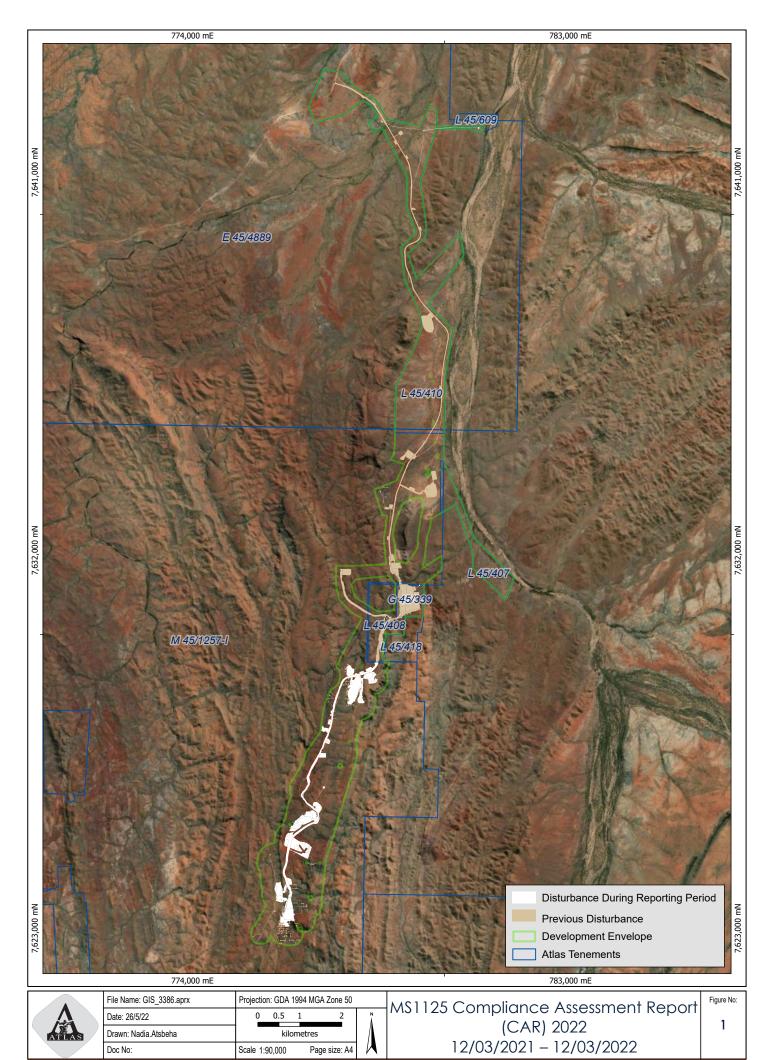

Confirmation of Abstraction under GWL176960(6)

Atlas Iron has been granted a licence to take water under section 5c of the Rights in Water and Irrigation (RIWI) Act 1914 to facilitate various activities related to mining at the Sanjiv Ridge mine. The instrument number allocated to this licence is GWL176960(6). The annual allocation limit granted by GWL176960(6) is 1,100,000 kL per annum. The volume of groundwater abstracted under GWL176960(5) is reported to the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) annually. In addition, this letter provides a summary of groundwater abstraction that has occurred under GWL176960(6) to demonstrate compliance with Condition 1-1 of Ministerial Statement 1125.

The reporting period for the second Compliance Assessment Report for Ministerial Statement 1125 is 12 March 2021 to 12 March 2022. The reporting period defined by GWL176960(6), otherwise known as the 'water year', is 1 July to 30 June each year. The total volumes of groundwater abstracted during each of these reporting periods is summarised in Table 1.

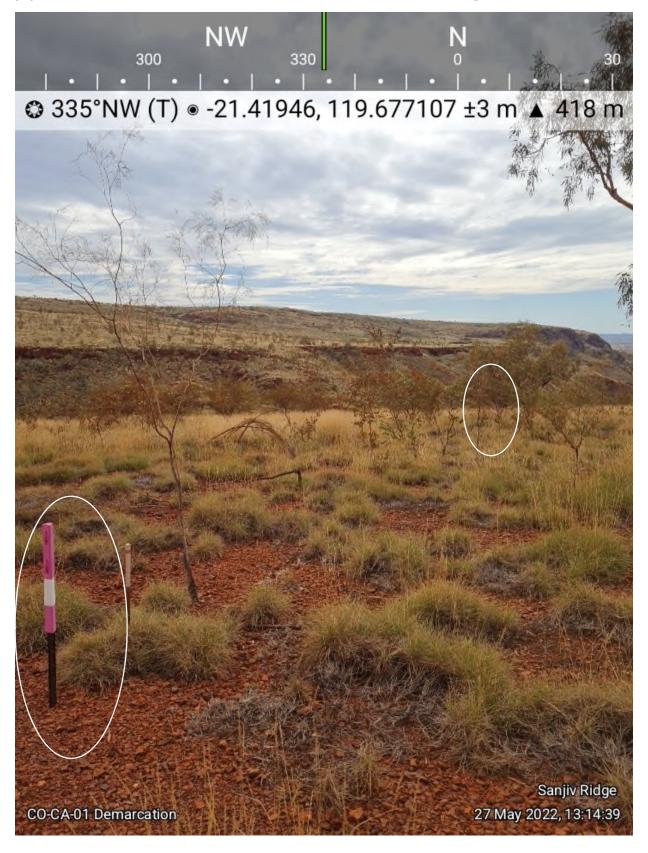
